## **Biographical**

Henry (Harry) and John Bannister were born in Conway, Massachusetts, and moved to St. Lawrence County with their mother Mary Nash after the death of his father. Mary married Asa Conkey and went on to have 4 children including Theodore and Charles Nash Conkey.

Theodore Conkey moved to Fond du Lac, Wisconsin where he raised a group of volunteers that were incorporated into the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wisconsin Volunteer Cavalry Regiment, Company I.

Charles Nash Conkey married Susan Page, daughter of Elias Page and sister of William (Harlan), Orville, and Clinton. Clinton was a member of the 30<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Infantry Regiment which was involved in the Battle of Baton Rouge.

# **Collection Organization**

**Series 1** is a handmade pamphlet including lists of scholars names attending certain schools on specific dates from 1810-1815.

**Series 2** is correspondence starting in 1816 through 1849. It includes 27 letters from members of the Bannister, Nash, Conkey, and Page families, including a letter to Asa Conkey from Silas Wright, Governor of New York.

**Series 3** is 13 letters from the 1850s, with over half of them written by Harry Bannister.

**Series 4** includes 29 letters from the 1860s mostly written by Harry Bannister and Clinton Page.

**Series 5** is correspondence from the 1870s, with 4 out of 5 letters written by Harry Bannister.

**Series 6** is a miscellaneous category including loose envelopes, undated letters and a rough sketch of the Battle of Baton Rouge
