The collection consists of drawings, prints, and monographs that are illustrated by British sculptor and engraver Eric Gill. The collection primarily consists of illustrations made for books, with special interest in illustrations done for Golden Cockerel Press books.

Biographical Note

Eric Gill (1882-1940) art encompassed sculpture, drawing, engraving, and type design. One of the most celebrated British artists of the twentieth century, the *Oxford Dictionary of National Biography* describes Gill as "the greatest artist-craftsman of the twentieth century: a letter-cutter and type designer of genius." Gill's work on type design and illustrations for books began in earnest in 1925 when Gill met Robert Gibbings who was owner of Golden Cockerel Press. Working in collaboration with Gibbings Gill designed type for and illustrated what were to become Golden Cockerel's most famous books and some of the most famous examples of Fine Press printing. Writing of Gill's work for Golden Cockerel in a 1989 biography, Fiona MacCarthy wrote:

But it was the book and later on the typeface designed for [Gibbings] that made the reputation of the Golden Cockerel. They have a forcefulness and clarity which still excites one...For a while the Golden Cockerel was Eric Gill.

St Lawrence's collection is focused on Gill the illustrator.

Pen and ink drawing for an unrealized manuscript, 4 inches long by 3 inches high. It appears to be a religious scene, an angel appearing before a man chained to the floor (?). The paper appears to be salvaged from an old envelope.

Prints

Gill made six wood engravings to illustrate Shakespeare's *King Henry VIII* which were published by the Limited Editions Club in 1939 in an edition of 1950 copies. The print is a version of the title page, 12 and 6/16th high by 7 ½ inches long, depicts Henry on his knees next to a standing smiling woman. Signed. **On display in the Reading Room**.
