Make Visible: North Country, Dear North Country 2025 MSS Collection #232

Scope & Content

This collection consists of materials generated by the "Make Visible: North Country" project which was undertaken at St. Lawrence University in the summer and fall of 2024, and the spring of 2025 (https://www.shannonnovak.com/make-visible-north-country).

The project was initiated by Shannon Novak, an artist, curator, activist and director of the international Safe Space Alliance, and was designed to contribute to the statewide "Make Visible: New York" project. Notable among the planned activities was a community letter writing project, which Novak described as one where "people can write an open response/letter to the prompt 'Dear North Country.' The instruction is, 'What would you like people to know about what it's like being LGBTQI2S+ in North Country?' So it's like an open letter to 'North Country' from local LGBTQI+ people."

The "Dear North Country" letter writing was led by Brush Art Gallery Director Catherine Tedford on February 26, 2025, in the Ireland Room of the Noble Center. As part of the "Make Visible: North Country," participants in the 1991 St Lawrence University Arts Festival "Out Art" and other members of the St. Lawrence LGBTQI2S+ community were interviewed by Special Collections and Archives Librarian Paul Doty. Transcripts of those interviews and other materials related to the "Out Art" Festival are part of the collection.
